

Clergy of the Year



Monsignor W. Ronald Jameson

Rev. Msgr. Jameson, Rector of Cathedral of St. Matthew the Apostle since 1995, is a graduate of St. Mary's Seminary and the Theological College of Catholic University. He was ordained in St. Matthew's Cathedral on May 18, 1968, by Cardinal O'Boyle and his first two assignments were in Maryland parishes, and then St. Matthew's from 1974 to 1985.

Prior to becoming Rector, Msgr. Jameson was the Director of Liturgy for the Archdiocese of Washington. In 1985, he was named pastor of Holy Redeemer Parish, and in 1992 he became Cardinal Hickey's Secretary for

Parish Life and Worship. He was named a Prelate of Honor with the title Monsignor in 1995. Msgr. Jameson has devoted time and leadership on the Priests' Personnel Board, Catholic Charities' Board of Directors, and Chair of the Council of Priests. He was Coordinator of the liturgies celebrated by Pope John Paul II in 1979. He is a member of the Order of the Holy Sepulchre and is a Magistral Chaplain of the Order of Malta

Msgr. Jameson's legacy to St. Matthew's will undoubtedly be his enduring interest in building community in the parish, establishing a parish archive, the restoration of the Cathedral, and the construction of the office building adjacent to the Cathedral.
